Activities

AIDS awareness campaign:

AMS organized AIDS awareness campaign in 5 villages of Chhatarpur in which 223 villagers took part. They were given the information about the AIDS, how to prevent from it, and what precaution should be taken. They were told that Acquired Immuno Deficiency Syndrome is a disease of the human immune system caused by the human immunodeficiency virus (HIV). This condition progressively reduces the effectiveness of the immune system and leaves individuals susceptible to opportunistic infections and tumors. HIV is transmitted through direct contact of mucous membrane or the bloodstream with a bodily fluid containing HIV, such as blood, semen, vaginal fluid, preseminal fluid, and breast milk. This transmission can involve anal, vaginal or oral sex, blood transfusion, contaminated hypodermic needles, exchange between mother and baby during pregnancy childbirth, breastfeeding or other exposure to one of the above bodily fluids.

Special day program:

AMS organized a village level program in 10 villages of Chhatarpur. The villagers were told about the celebration of special days in the memories of martyrs who had given their lives for the sake of our country. Such days are celebrated in the memories of Sardar Bhagat Singh, Chandrashekhar Azad, Sukhdeo and Rajguru, Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru etc. The villagers were informed that these persons were having a high moral characters and were determined to do something concrete for their country.



Health Camps:

AMS organized health camps in 10 villages of Chhatarpur for the benefit of poorer and deprived section of the society. The specialist doctors viz. heart specialist, ophthalmologist, dermatologist, general practicetioners, gynecologist were invited to render their services in the camps. The necessary medicines were distributed free of cost to the poorer families. About 275 persons, women and children took benefit in these health camps and avail the facilities arranged by AMS for them.



<u>Awareness campaign- Nasha Mukti Abhiyan:</u>

AMS organized Nash Mukti Abhiyan in 5 villages of Chhatarpur block and near about 300 persons participated in the program. They were told about the Alcoholism, also known as alcohol dependence, is a disease that includes the following four symptoms: craving i.e. a strong need, or urge to drink, loss of control i.e. not being able to stop drinking once drinking has begun, physical dependence i.e. withdrawal symptoms, such as nausea, sweating, shakiness and anxiety after stopping drinking and tolerance i.e. the need to drink greater amounts of alcohol to get "high". The people were advised to avoid or leave drinking habit as it is very much bad for the health and also for the family

Workshop for water conservation:

A workshop has been organized for the volunteers and farmers to make them known about the importance of water and how to conserve it. A total of 65 people participated in it. The water conservation was defined to them as any beneficial reduction in water loss, use or waste as well as the preservation of water quality. A reduction in water use accomplished by implementation of water conservation or water efficiency measures or improved water management practices that reduce or enhance the beneficial use of water. They were told that water efficiency is a tool of water conservation. That results in more efficient water use and thus reduces water demand. The value and cost-effectiveness of a water efficiency measure must be evaluated in relation to its effects on the use and cost of other natural resources.

Beti Bachao Campaion

By keeping an aim in the mind, AMS organized Rath Yatra in 10 villages of district Chhatarpur to make the public aware about the various government schemes. During the campaign, the public was addressed to know about various government schemes by which they can be benefited especially with the scheme related with women and children. They were told that they should send schools to their daughter and as per their status can use various benefits government is offering. They should send their children in the anganwadis so that children can develop the habit of sitting in anganwadis, can be immunized and also can get nutritional supplementary food. The queries of the villages were replied well and their doubts have been cleared.

Nadep Building

AMS organized NADEP awareness meetings in 13 villages of district Chhatarpur for the benefit of farmers. A total of 415 men and women participated in it. NADEP (National Agribusiness Development Program) composting method is for quick recycling of agro wastes. The villagers were told that the NADEP method of organic composting was developed by a Gandhian worker called Narayan Deotao Pandharipande of Maharashtra (Pusad). Compost can be prepared from a wide range of organic materials including dead plant material such as crop residues, weeds, forest litter ad kitchen waste. Compost making is an efficient way of converting all kinds biomass into high value fertilizer that serves as a good alternative to farmyard manure, especially for crop-growing households without livestock.

Seed Bank

AMS arranged the meetings in 13 villages of district Chhatarpur in which the villagers were advised to form grain/seed bank so that in case of need they can take the benefit of this arrangement. This can also be utilized for the seed exchange purpose. Community based seed bank are an old practice and it gives good results for the good crop and cultivation.
